SCRIPTURE READING: John 14:15-21 (NRSV)

"If you love me, you will keep my commandments. And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate, to be with you forever. This is the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive, because it neither sees him nor knows him. You know him, because he abides with you, and he will be in you.

"I will not leave you orphaned; I am coming to you. In a little while the world will no longer see me, but you will see me; because I live, you also will live. On that day you will know that I am in my Father, and you in me, and I in you. They who have my commandments and keep them are those who love me; and those who love me will be loved by my Father, and I will love them and reveal myself to them."

SERMON by Rev. Dr Peter Walker

The philosopher Aristotle taught that we are all essentially political animals,

By which he meant that human beings were created to live in groups and in communities - to live in a 'polis'.

For instance, Aristotle even went so far as to teach that an immoral person is a person without friends.

Only friends make us a moral being because they tell us the truth about ourselves - truth that those who are not as close as friends are never likely to tell us.

Only friends know how to break that truth, in the right way. Pity the person who is without friends, said Aristotle, someone without people to say what they need to be told. Though you probably hold greater sympathy for the person who is without friends, you can pick up the logic of Aristotle's argument.

Aristotle's view clashes head-on with today's prevailing view of a human being.

Most people today prefer to think that we are essentially selfmade.

Dependent on no one.

And if we cannot stand alone, if we do depend on others, Then there's something wrong with us.

The ability to stand alone is the sign of a successful modern life.

The legacy of this move to individualism is all around us. Think of all those communities that should be working, and yet are failing: families, neighbourhoods, clubs, churches, nations.

The list could go on.

This is the sad harvest of the view that the individual human

being stands supreme, not the community.

Chapter 15 of John's Gospel shows us that the Christian view of our humanity stands in stark contrast to the contemporary western concept of the person, and is actually much closer to Aristotle!

We believe that God has created us, and Christ has commanded us, to lean on one another when we need help; and that God has created us, and Christ has commanded us, to give help to others when they need someone to lean on.

Three times in this passage our Gospel links obedience with love:

- If you love me, you will keep my commandments (15)
- They who have my commandments and keep them are those who love me (21)
- Whoever does not love me, does not keep my words (24)

And we also know that which Jesus described as the greatest of all commandments: Love God, and love your neighbour as yourself.

The sign of our faith in Christ, and our obedience to him, is not a matter of belief,

but a matter of love.

The basic unit of life is not the individual.

The basic unit of life is an individual who loves others.

And, we might add, who is willing to be loved by others.

The basic unit of life is a loving community...

loving family, loving friends, loving church.

I suspect that this time of isolation has reminded most of us, if not all,

That true life is found in our connectedness, not our individualism.

And that our deepest joy is found in giving ourselves to others,

Not giving and holding all things to ourselves. I hope that is something we can hold onto when this pandemic is over.

People are often heard to say that they want to be free; They long for freedom.

I say it. Maybe you do as well.

Yet it is one of the ironies of life that,

if freedom to us means freedom from dependence on others, if we try to free ourselves of dependencies and attachments - to be the modern ideal of humanity - the self-made person - we will end, not with freedom, but enslavement.

I know people, and I don't doubt you know some too, whose lives and well-being have been destroyed because they have loved only themselves.

However, I cannot think of anybody I know who has had their life or well-being destroyed because she or he was lovingly obedient to Christ's call to love one another.

It is costly - and it should be costly.

But that love is life's true freedom, and true meaning.

Our humanity is given its truth within community.

AN AFFIRMATION OF FAITH

I remember hearing a story about a young priest, confessing to his mentor that he struggled to say some of the words of the creeds because he either didn't believe them or didn't understand them. To which his mentor answered, "I don't say the words of creed for myself, I say them for those who cannot yet say them and believe them."

There are churches who would say the creed every Sunday as a matter of tradition.

I think I am a bit like the young priest, struggling to ask individuals to say words they are not sure they believe.

But what if we affirmed our faith not so much for ourselves but for the person who needs to hear the words spoken for them? Creeds were shaped in the politics of the early church, they invite people to opt in rather than opt out of believing.
